Tshepang provides meals and afterschool education support to these children. Why did you decide to teach for Tshepang?

From the Tshepang program, I've learned to collaborate effectively with diverse individuals and adapt to different situations. I've gained experience in creating orderly plans to address urgent situations when they happen.

Leader Spotlight: Luming Wang

Tshepang English Director

Why did you decide to teach for Tshepang?

I decided to teach for Tshepang because I believed in the message of BOBtutor, "Bring more educational opportunities to underprivileged students around the world." When I learned about what the Tshepang Center is, I decided that I wanted to make a change in the lives of the students there.

What is unique about the Tshepang program that separates it from the other programs?

What separates the Tshepang program from other programs is the nature of the classes. Having taught in the Saturday South Africa Program, the group lessons of the Tshepang sets it apart from the one-on-one settings of the many other programs. You have to engage all of the students in the class, which can sometimes be more than ten students.

What is special about the Tshepang students?

Something I think is special about Tshepang students is their engagement with English. They are always eager to ask questions when I prompt them and always try their best to read the passages even if they are difficult. They also love to describe what they do during the week and it's enjoyable listening to them talk about it.

What challenges have you faced as Tshepang program director?

There have been many challenges as Tshepang program director. Because South Africa's time zone is so different from the United States, the only available hours currently is 7 am on a Wednesday. As a result, it was difficult to find tutors who could reliably come during these hours. Some other small issues are because of the location of the Tshepang center, their wifi

sometimes is not the best, having disconnections. Teaching the lessons itself also has some challenges, as because of the size of the class, it is sometimes very

difficult to engage all of the students.

What would you say to prospective tutors who would consider joining Tshepang?

We would love for you to join the program. I know the program timing is very difficult to accommodate but I think that teaching the students is very rewarding. The classes are only 45 minutes long, so it's not very long, so if you're interested please let me know!
